21 MAY 2017


Have you ever sensed that something is moving within you that you cannot explain? You are faced with a situation that you cannot resolve; you are frightened to speak in case you say the wrong words, then something just happens, an opportunity arises and you are speaking, the words are flowing and the fear is gone. You cannot understand the power that is moving through you, you are just grateful that somehow you have the courage to act and make a difference.

The Holy Spirit is the inspiration that raises our hearts and gives us the courage to speak. Love is flowing from our heavenly Father, through his precious Son and the Holy Spirit, lifting us up, enriching our lives, creating a power within us that is from God. This is the power that gave Philip the courage to go to those old enemies of the Jews, the Samaritans, and stand before them and speak to them about the Good News. This same spirit entered the hearts of his listeners and led them to baptism and a new life in the emerging church of Christ.

Saint Peter travelled the known world bringing the Good News to the pagans and to the Jews. His constant companion was the Holy Spirit. It enabled him to face all sorts of problems in his mission to bring the word of God to his people. The

people he spoke to were searching; they lived from day to day without any real hope for the future. Peter tells us how we too can become beacons of light to those who are without hope. "Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you have". There are many in our families, our workplaces and our neighbourhoods who are without hope. Peter advises us to be courteous, respectful and conscientious in our dealings with others; there are many who will listen and walk away, we only sow the seed, the love of God brings it to harvest.

John's gospel is made for Easter. His words of encouragement are there for all. The promise, made by Jesus, speaks to our hearts. We are not orphans in this world. We have a heavenly Father who loves us, a brother who is our Saviour and a Spirit, living within us, whose power can strengthen and guide us. Jesus promises us that "One day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you"; We are one with Christ. This is the encouragement we need to speak to others and remind them that God's love is there waiting for them to turn to Him and say, "Abba Father".
